Simple View of Reading

Language Comprehension (meaning) multiplied by Decoding/Word Recognition (code) equals Reading Comprehension

What is Building on Patterns (BOP)?

- Building on Patterns, often known as BOP, is a complete primary literacy program designed to teach students the braille code and reading skills.
- The Big Five are interwoven throughout the BOP series.

 Phonemic awareness, phonics, comprehension, fluency, vocabulary
- The introduction of braille contractions is purposeful.
- All braille contractions are taught by the end of Second Grade.
- Instruction is systematic and explicit.





History of APH's Braille Literacy Program

Patterns

- Released in 1980-1981 school year
- Readiness, Preprimer, and Primer
- Designed to teach reading to children who will use braille as their principal learning medium.

Building on Patterns

- First revision initiative, 2006
- Includes 5 critical skill areas: The Big
 Five
- Addition of pre-Kindergarten content
- Development of website
- UEB revision, began in 2014

Phonemic Awareness

- A phoneme is an individual unit of speech sound.
- Example: The word "cat" has three phonemes, /c/ /a/ /t/.
- Schwa sound /uh/
- Do not add a schwa sound at the end of phonemes.
- Phoneme, Grapheme, Morpheme
- Phonemic Awareness vs. Phonics





Phonemic Awareness: The Big 5 in BOP Prekindergarten

- BOP Prekindergarten, Volume 1, Lesson 4, p. 147 Teacher's Manual
- Initial Sound of y/y/
- Gather objects that begin with the letter y, such as yo-yo, yarn, yam, yogurt, or yardstick. Say the sound of the letter y /y/ to the child several times and ask her to repeat it. Present each object, name it together, and emphasize the beginning /y/ sound. Identify this beginning sound as the sound of the letter y. Ask the child if she can think of any other words that begin with the same sound (examples: yes, yawn, yellow, yucky, yummy)

Phonics

- We learned that phonemic awareness is the understanding that spoken words consist of individual units of speech sound, phonemes.
- Phonics teaches the relationship between individual sounds, phonemes, and the letters that represent them, graphemes.
- Where do morphemes fit into phonics instruction?





Phonics: The Big 5 in BOP Kindergarten

- BOP Kinder Lesson 27, p. 296 of the teacher's manual
- Ask the child to turn to page 6. Give the child a crayon. Tell the child that you are going to say a word for each line. Tell the child to look at the letters in the line and mark the one that stands for the sound at the beginning of the word you say.





BOP Kindergarten Update

- Currently undergoing complete revision
- Prototype ready fall 2023
- Full year of field testing
