## **APH Museum Welcomes Cultural Pass Holders**

**Louisville, KY (June 1, 2022)** – The APH Museum is participating in the 2022 Cultural Pass program, beginning today, through Sunday, September 4. Passes can be acquired by visiting your local library’s website and following their instructions. They can also be picked up in-person at a local library.

According to [Louisvilleky.gov](http://Louisvilleky.gov), “The Cultural Pass is an innovative initiative to promote art and culture and improve summer learning in our community. Nearly 240,000 passes have been issued since its inception in 2014.”

“The Cultural Pass is a great program that allows the community to come in and learn about the amazing artifacts we’ve got,” said Micheal Hudson, APH Museum Director. “From tactile printing and writing, to learning about Helen Keller, to early braille devices. There is so much to explore.”

APH Museum drop-in guided tours of the APH Factory and Museum are available at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., Monday through Thursday, except federal holidays. During your tour, you’ll explore braille production, the Talking Book studio, educational aids design and production, and end with a chance to explore our museum featuring hundreds of years of blindness history. Reservations are not required, but we encourage you to let us know if you have a group larger than 10. Face masks are not required, however, social distancing will be encouraged.
